CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK - MONDAY 3RD - SUNDAY 9TH FEBRUARY

Children's Mental Health Week 2025 is taking place from Monday 3rd until Sunday 9th February. This year we're exploring our theme 'Know Yourself, Grow Yourself'. This theme is about empowering young people to embrace self-awareness and explore what it means to them so they can build resilience, grow and develop.

PARKING

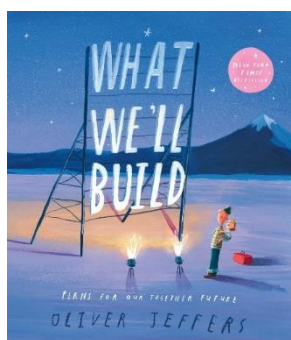
Please can we remind parents and carers that it is illegal to stop or park cars on the yellow zig-zag lines on Cameron Street and the white zig-zag lines on Haydn Road to drop off and pick up children. Please be aware that any vehicle parked on yellow zig-zag lines outside school during the times shown on the nearby sign will be issued by the local authority, with a PCN (Parking Charge Notice) which will not be cancelled under any circumstances. This is the same for the white zig-zag lines by the crossing on Haydn Road which are there to provide pedestrians, children and staff a clear, unobstructed view of the road. **These lines are enforced 24-hours a day, every day.** As parking on white zig-zag lines puts pedestrians at risk, police will always issue a Fixed Penalty Notice without exceptions. A police fine also carries penalty points. If you do drive to school, please arrive in plenty of time and ensure that you park legally and safely before allowing children to exit cars.

National Storytelling Week 2025

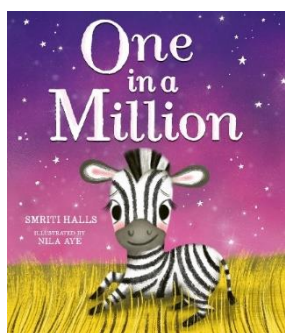
