SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

1 Introduction

- 1.1** It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for school uniform both in our school prospectus and on our school website. (See Appendix 1)

2 Aims and objectives

- 2.1** Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:
- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
 - engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
 - is practical and smart;
 - identifies the children with the school;
 - prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class;
 - makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
 - is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents;
 - is designed with health and safety in mind.

3 Jewellery

- 3.1** On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain. We ask the children to either remove these objects during PE and games, or cover them with a plaster, to prevent them from causing injury. In any case where the parents insist that they wear objects during PE the parents must give written consent and acceptance of liability.

4 Footwear

- 4.1** The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school. We require all children to wear shoes as stated in the uniform list.

5 The role of parents

- 5.1** We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.
- 5.2** If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the headteacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their

child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will look sympathetically at such requests.

6 The role of governors

- 6.1** The governing body supports the headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.
- 6.2** It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities.
- 6.3** Governors ensure that the school uniform policy helps children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

7 Monitoring and review

- 7.1** The governing body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its committee work by:
- seeking the views of parents, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy;
 - considering, with the headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform;
 - requiring the headteacher to report to the governors on the way the school uniform policy is implemented.

School Uniform

School uniform does not have to have the Haydn logo, it can be plain, and can be purchased from any store, supermarket, charity shop or second-hand uniform shop. You can order uniform with the school logo by visiting www.just-schoolwear.co.uk

SCHOOL UNIFORM MUST BE WORN THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL INCLUDING NURSERY.

- Footwear can be any sensible shoes, in black, navy or brown.
- Trousers, skirts or pinafores can be grey, black or navy. No jeans.
- Jogging bottoms in grey, black or navy can be worn in the Early Years but not in main school.
- School shirts, blouses and polo shirts are white or pale blue.
- Jumpers, cardigans, sweatshirts are navy or grey.

Summer Uniform

- Summer dresses are blue checks.
- Shorts are grey, black or navy.

PE Kit

- White T-shirts
- Navy or black shorts
- Navy or black jogging bottoms for outdoor PE in the winter
- Black or white trainers or plimsolls

Clothing needs to be named because all uniform is very similar and needs to be identified easily.
