NURSERY SUMMER TERM 2026

Welcome back! We hope you all had a wonderful spring break and look forward to a happy and eventful summer term.

Our Topics

Much of our learning this half term will be based around the theme of '*Real Life Superheroes!*' We are going to investigate the roles of different people in our community and find out how they help others. We invite any nursery family members in to talk about their job role, or to send in photographs. Please see Class Dojo for more information. To help embed our learning and develop our understanding of different job roles, we will enjoy lots of themed role-play. Later in the term, our nursery will be transformed into a Teddy Bear Hospital! There will be several stations for the children and their teddy bears to explore, including an x-ray station, a sensory station and a consultation station.

Our Traditional Tale this half term is called '*The Gingerbread Man*'. We will practise being super storytellers and will create our very own story maps. We will also become bakers and will enjoy making and decorating gingerbread.

Our final half-term will follow the theme of '*Changing and Growing*'. We will learn about the lifecycle of a butterfly and will work together to look after our class caterpillars. We will plant flowers and buds to observe, look after and help transform our nursery garden for summer. We invite any parents or carers in to help us with our planting. Our Traditional Tale will be, '*Jack and the Beanstalk*' and we can't wait to investigate what happens as we plant real beans! We will also think about how we have grown and changed since starting nursery and will celebrate the amazing and very grown-up things we can do now.

We look forward to inviting you into our nursery on many occasions over the final few months together. We have some exciting plans for our Father's Day celebrations in June, will take part in our very own Sports Day and will enjoy an end of year family picnic in our nursery garden.

Sound of the Week

Alongside our topics, we will continue to develop important speaking and listening skills and learn to recognise, segment and blend sounds in words.

Transition to School

As the term progresses, we will be carefully considering how to ensure the children have a positive transition into their reception year either here at Haydn or into their new setting. We will keep you informed of any information regarding this nearer the time.

At home, it would be brilliant for the children to continue to build their independence. Being independent is a useful skill when a child starts school, so encourage your little one to do things like getting dressed themselves, blowing their own nose and going to the toilet alone.

Make sure you give them plenty of time to practise these important life skills and remember to praise all their efforts, no matter how small, as this will build their confidence. There's no rush and every child progresses at their own speed.
