



RESULTS FOR ANNUAL QUESTIONNAIRE FOR PARENTS AND CARERS SPRING 2026

The results are in! Thank you so much to everyone who completed our recent parental questionnaire. We have received **95** completed questionnaires (20% of our families) - please see the results below. We are happy that such a high number of our families who completed the survey felt that their child feels safe, happy and well looked after at school. 83% of parents who responded felt that their child is making good progress and is taught well. We know we don't always get things right every time and that we can't always please everyone in all aspects of school life, however much we try. But we would like you all to know that we will take on board your comments. The results of this will be discussed and shared at the governor's meeting in June and with staff so that we can make our school an even better place to be for pupils and parents. Parents' suggestions are gratefully received and will be considered as we set our school development priorities for the future.

The survey is digitally sent out annually and we would welcome the responses of many more of you in the future. Your views are important to us!
